## DISSENTERS THEORY OF CHANGE: WE ARE IN PHASE 1

Dissenters is leading a new generation of young people to reclaim our resources from the war industry, reinvest in life-giving services, and repair collaborative relationships with the earth and people globally.

Dissenters' plan to win involves three phases:

**Phase 1**: Run campus campaigns to disrupt the war industry and develop hundreds of strong BIPOC leaders and organizers committed to anti-militarism. (3-5 years)


**Phase 2**: Run on and off campus campaigns nationally, to stigmatize war and pressure elected officials to take bold stances & divest from war profiteers. (3-5 years)


**Phase 3**: Introduce sweeping legislation to divest from the Pentagon, and invest in our communities.

Dissenters launched in January of 2020, just two months before the COVID-19 pandemic would alter the world as we knew it. We have had to be adaptive, bold, and creative to build our movement, and are currently in the early stages of Phase 1 of our plan to win.

### DISSENTERS CHAPTERS

Since our founding, we've developed 30 chapters across Turtle Island. The pins on this map show our current distribution of chapters.









### DISSENTERS CAMPAIGNS

Our members are running hard-hitting campaigns to disrupt business as usual on their campuses, and stigmatize war & militarism. All of the campaigns we're running use one of the following frameworks:

#### **Divest From Death**

A campaign to pressure colleges and universities to cut ties and/or divest from the Top 5 U.S. companies profiting from war: Lockheed Martin, Raytheon, Boeing, Northrop Grumman and General Dynamics.

### **Recruiters off Campus**


A campaign to drive war recruiters off campus, including both Department of Defense and private corporations seeking to hire graduating students to advance war & militarism

A campaign to disarm and disband campus police departments which frequentlypatrol and harass local communities in addition to upholding racism and repression on

## PRINCIPLE 6: WEUPLIFTTHE VOICES AND LEADERSHIP OF THOSE MOST OFTEN AT THE **MARGINS**



### ANTI-MILITARIST ORGANIZING FELLOWSHIP

Dissenters' Anti-Militarist Organizing Fellowship is a 12-week stipended program that trains US-based BIPOC college students on the fundamentals of anti-militarist organizing, and provides deep leadership development, coaching, and community to a dedicated cohort of student organizers.

"During the fellowship I learned important base building, organizational, and campaign-development skills and gained a community of young people who are just as committed to ending U.S. imperialism and endless war as I am...After four inspiring months with the Dissenters Fellowship, we organized a major campaign targeting 5 of the biggest arms manufacturers in the world, successfully passing our resolution through Student Government and taking this momentum all the way to the Board of Regents.

Students have always been leaders in the movement for social justice— the Dissenters Fellowship helps students across occupied Turtle Island (so-called U.S.) build upon this legacy and transform our campuses into bases of political power and radical imagination."

She not only is building her chapter, but helping shape national discourse on the centrality of student organizing to progressive social movements. Rosario recently spoke on a national panel on the threat of far right movements, given her experiences organizing on campus in Tallahassee with Dissenters.

## TIDALWAVE CONVERGENCE: CHICAGO

We hosted our inaugural national convening, the Dissenters Tidalwave Convergence, from September 9-11, 2022 in Chicago, Illinois. Over 80 people attended, including 60 new student members, and a training team of 12 Dissenters student alumni who led workshops like Dissenters' Plan to Win, the State of the Empire, Winning the Story & Campus Narrative Strategy, Campaigns & Organizing 101, Building Healthy Groups, and more.

The convening was an absolutely central tool in laying the foundations for a powerful year of anti-militarist organizing across campuses. On the last day, attendees participated in a demonstration coordinated by our only off-campus campaign 'Boeing Arms Genocide.'

Elias, a Dissenter from Stanford, shared that attending Tidalwave "was a radically transformative experience." He said, "I left so energized to organize against war and militarism on my campus, including shutting down a CIA Recruitment Event, countering a reactionary "Academic Freedom" conference on campus, and creating a coalition of student organizations to create more effective campaigns for a politically-agitated 2023."



### TRAINING COMMITTEE

Our Dissenters Training committee works to lead our national workshops and our in-person gatherings. This team works hard to skill-up our student leaders and dedicates time and energy to curriculum development and training practice.

"Training with Dissenters has given me the opportunity to not only build long-lasting, meaningful connections across our movement but also grow skills and knowledge that make me a better overall organizer. ### STORYTELLING COMMITTEE

A team of Dissenters student alumni that meet regularly to support with the creation of digital content, op eds, and other communications needs to further Dissenters' reach and vision.

"Putting on workshops, passing knowledge and resources between all of us in the movement to hone our skills in storytelling,...and to share connections and get people's art out there," has been the most meaningful part of the storytelling committee for **Anousha**, Storytelling Committee Member.

## INTERNATIONAL SOLIDARITY COMMITTEE

The International Solidarity Committee works to support international relationship building between Dissenters and politically aligned activists and movements globally, coordinate political education efforts to deepen the internationalist analysis and politic of Dissenters' base, and mobilize in response to international events as is aligned with Dissenters DNA and points of unity.

In 2022, Dissenters leaders joined a delegation to Cuba with other leftist organizations from across Turtle Island.



## PRINCIPLE 7: WEEMBRACE EXPERIMENTATION, REFLECTION, AND GROWTH



### REGIONAL GATHERINGS

This spring, Dissenters hosted two multi-day gatherings, with students in the Midwest in February, and the East Coast/South in March. Forty students attended each of the gatherings, where they received training in campaign strategies, recruiting techniques, and developed relationships with other Dissenters members from schools in their region.



### NATIONAL CALLS



Our monthly National Calls offer political education and cross-chapter collaboration opportunities for our students.

In April, we spotlighted our Hampton University chapter for their creative base-building and recruitment tactics.

In May, we collaborated with Dr. Ather Zia of Stand With Kashmir for a teach-in on India's occupation of Kashmir and organizing efforts ahead of the global G20 summit there.

Previous calls have covered topics including: a Cuba Delegation report-back, conversations on what it means to be in Principled Struggle with one another, and skillshares on grassroots fundraising.

### BOEING ARMS GENOCIDE

The #BoeingArmsGenocide (BAG) campaign in Chicago is our first experiment with off-campus campaigns. Alumni from our founding student chapters launched BAG in the summer of 2021, after Israel's brutal bombing of Gaza and Palestinian civil society's call to stop a \$700 million sale of Boeing weapons to Israel.

### **CAMPAIGN VICTORY**

In the first year (2021), BAG targeted Chicago's tax subsidies for the Boeing Corporate Headquarters in Chicago, demanding public dollars not go to this war profiteer.





Ahead of the end of Boeing's 20 year contract with the city, organizers met with the Office of Inspector General (OIG) and City Council Members to ensure there would be no secret extension of the contract.

As a result of OIG and

FOIA (Freedom of Information Act) inquiries regarding Boeing's tax reimbursements, the campaign successfully blocked the world's second largest war profiteer from receiving its final payment from the city - a victory of nearly \$2 million.

Now, the organizers are focused on stopping the construction of a drone manufacturing facility in central Illinois that is slated to receive \$9 million in tax subsidies from Governor JB Pritzker and open in 2025.

In May of 2023, the campaign shut down a panel featuring the Melisa Orme, Vice President of Boeing's operations overseeing drone manufacturing at the Rapid + TCT conference in Chicago. the first protest in the history of additive manufacturing, revealing the massive role that 3D printing engineers are playing in the war industry.

# PRINCIPLE 4: WE GROW OUR POWER BY TALKING TO NEW PEOPLE







In the coming year, we seek to garner national press coverage to advance our movement. Stay tuned.



### VOLUNTEER SUPPORT COMMITTEES

**Coaching Network**: A resource for Dissenters campus organizers to connect, build relationships, and talk shop with experienced organizers. **Fundraising Committee**: A team of Dissenters volunteers that help identify new donors and supporters of our work, ensuring we have the resources needed to scale-up our work.

**Safety through Practice & Accountability (SPA Team)**: A team that provides trainings and rapid response support for instances of harm and sexual violence within Dissenters.
